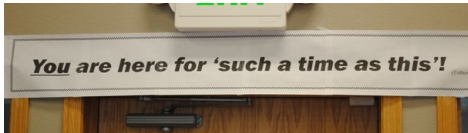

News of this transition has spread to other Christian radio networks and individual stations throughout Alaska. **KVRM** (the Native outreach station) in particular has other organizations approaching the NLN for opportunities to join us in some way.

This creates the potential that in the very near future NLN programming could be *realistically* covering the state *from the west coast to the southeast*

Our goal of arriving in Alaska by July 1, 2010 may have come and gone, but we are not discouraged. In fact, we have been encouraged by recent major transitions made by the Network.

The NLN has a more focused mission with new leadership in place and emphasis on

How does this quote apply to our situation? We’d like to take a moment and work backwards through it:

- Your charitable giving is vertical, between you and God. The enclosed envelope and Promise Form are simply included for the convenience of those God has called to financially partner with us, and not to put any pressure on anyone. It is not unlike passing a collection plate at church. No expectations. As Paul wrote in his second letter to the Corinthian church: *“Each man should give what he has decided in his heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver.” 9:7 NIV*

If the envelope causes any uneasiness, please communicate that to us and it will no longer be included in future correspondence.

- We enjoy sharing this experience with you, but if you are not interested and would prefer not to receive our newsletter at all, of course we will respect your wishes. Please let us know. It *hurt* when we received one of our newsletters returned with no explanation.

- If you have been prompted by God to support His work in Alaska, let your ‘Yes’ be ‘Yes’ and please send in your Faith Promise pledge as soon as you can. You

are not required to donate until we are on the field. When our monthly pledges are growing, it not only encourages us but when we approach a church that does not know us personally, it also demonstrates to them that God is leading this mission.

- Our only request is that you pray and ask God what role He has designated you to serve in fulfilling the Great Commission: *“Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you.”*
